**DISCLAIMER:** This report provides a snapshot of the Fort Worth Police Department's National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) data that was queried from the Records Management System (RMS) on November 7, 2016. The Department's RMS is updated regularly based on ongoing investigations. The data in this snapshot has been reviewed and certified by the Texas Department of Public Safety. Since this is a snapshot, data queried before or after this date is apt to change and may vary from other reports.

# **Section I.**

## **Understanding *NIBRS* Crime Reporting**

## **1.1 National Perspective on Reporting Crime: Transitioning from Uniform Crime Reporting to National Incident-Based Reporting System**

According to the National Incident-Based Reporting System, Volume 1: Data Collection Guidelines, by the U.S. Department of Justice,

“Since the establishment of the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program in 1930, the volume, diversity, and complexity of crime steadily increased while the UCR Program remained virtually unchanged. Recognizing the need to address crime’s growing challenge, the law enforcement community in the late 1970s called for a thorough study of the UCR Program with the objective of revising the Program to meet law enforcement’s needs into the twenty-first century. The National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) is the result of that study.”

In January 1989, the FBI began accepting NIBRS data from a handful of agencies. As more contributing law enforcement agencies learn about the rich data available through incident-based reporting (and as resources permit), more agencies are implementing the NIBRS. Although participation in NIBRS is purely voluntary, about 43 percent of all law enforcement agencies were NIBRS certified as of June 2012 (based on that year’s data submissions).

## **1.2 Fort Worth’s Crime Report**

Fort Worth understands the importance of collecting and reporting detailed, accurate, and meaningful incident-based data. In January 2006, Fort Worth was certified to participate in the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) and began reporting NIBRS data to the Texas Department of Public Safety. With the use of the NIBRS, the Fort Worth Police Department has the capability to generate reports reflecting a multitude of interrelationships among the collected data — enhancing its ability to analyze crime trends and to implement tactical strategies. NIBRS data is of great value to the City of Fort Worth!

As noted above, in 2012, approximately 43 percent of the reporting agencies throughout the nation were NIBRS certified, and an increasing number of agencies are transitioning to NIBRS. In the meantime, the FBI continues to report UCR data (by extracting UCR data from NIBRS data) until such time as the Uniform Crime Reporting can be discontinued. FBI data is used to identify national and regional crime trends. FBI data is often used for rankings — although the FBI does not recommend this practice — and is often considered the best available information to compare crime from one jurisdiction to another. Since UCR data is available for all reporting agencies nationwide, it is also used for the purpose of making comparisons.

One of Fort Worth’s five Strategic Goals is to become the safest major city in the United States. The FBI data, along with other third-party rankings, are used to determine if we are making progress towards this goal/vision. The Fort Worth Police Department reports NIBRS data so that elected officials, city leaders and the public can review the detailed crime data. ### 1.3 Understanding NIBRS Figures

NIBRS compiles detailed reports on two types of offenses: Group “A” offenses and Group “B” offenses. The two groupings are based on the amount of reporting required for each. Both incidents and arrests are reported for Group “A” offenses, while only arrests are reported for Group “B” offenses.

The following criteria is used to determine whether a crime should be designated as a Group “A” offense:

1. The seriousness or significance of the offense.
2. The frequency or volume of its occurrence.
3. The prevalence of the offense nationwide.
4. The probability of the offense being brought to law enforcement’s attention.
5. The likelihood that law enforcement is the best channel for collecting data regarding the offense.
6. The burden placed on law enforcement in collecting data on the offense.
7. The national statistical validity and usefulness of the collected data.
8. The national UCR Program’s responsibility to make crime data available not only to law enforcement but to others having a legitimate interest in it.

Group “A” offenses are categorized into one of the three following categories: 1) Crimes Against Persons; 2) Crimes Against Property; 3) Crimes Against Society.

- 1) Crimes Against Persons = Scores one offense for each victim
- 2) Crimes Against Property = Scores one offense for each distinct operation  
(except Motor Vehicle Theft / one offense is counted per stolen vehicle)
- 3) Crime Against Society = Scores one offense for each violation

(UCR Part I includes the following eight offenses: Criminal Homicide, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny-Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.)

### 1.4 Significant Methodology and Definition Differences

A significant difference between NIBRS and UCR Traditional Summary Reporting is that for Crimes Against Persons, NIBRS counts the number of victims, while UCR counts the number of incidents. Consequentially, NIBRS figures tend to show more Crimes Against Persons than UCR figures. In addition, the definitions for Part 1 offenses used in Summary Reporting are different than the offense definitions used by the NIBRS. # **National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS)**

## Third Quarter 2016 Citywide NIBRS Crime Report

2.1 Citywide Group A and B crime decreased 0.2 percent in the Third Quarter of 2016 compared to the Third Quarter of 2015. Crimes Against Persons increased 8.3 percent overall. Forcible sex offenses increased 22.4 percent while murder & nonnegligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter decreased 18.8 percent. Crimes Against Property decreased 1.1 percent overall with decreases in burglary/breaking & entering and arson while increases occurred in embezzlement, counterfeiting/forgery, and robbery.

## 2.2 Crimes Against Persons (NIBRS - Group A)

In the Third Quarter of 2016, Crimes Against Persons increased 8.3 percent overall with 3,568 offenses (victims) reported compared to 3,295 offenses (victims) reported in the Third Quarter of 2015. Forcible sex offenses increased 22.4 percent while murder & nonnegligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter decreased 18.8 percent. Of all the Crimes Against Persons in the Third Quarter of 2016, 56.8 percent were known to be domestic-related.

In the Third Quarter of 2016, there were 13 homicide victims, which is an decrease of three victims from the Third Quarter of 2015. These homicides were the result of a range of motives, including three domestic cases, three argument/fight cases, two drug related cases, one robbery case, and four unknown cases. Eight cases involved firearms. Six of the 13 cases have been filed. There were four homicides each in Council Districts 2 and 8, three in District 5, and one homicide each in Council Districts 6 and 7.

Most Crimes Against Persons are simple assaults, defined under NIBRS as an “unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.” Simple assaults increased 14.6 percent in the Third Quarter of 2016 compared to the Third Quarter of 2015. Approximately 66.9 percent of simple assault cases were known to be domestic-related.

The second-largest Crimes Against Persons category is aggravated assaults. Aggravated assaults decreased 7.9 percent in Third Quarter 2016 compared to Third Quarter 2015. Approximately 39.4 percent of aggravated assaults were known to be domestic-related. Nearly 53 percent of all aggravated assaults occurred within a residence, 23.2 percent near a roadway, 9.6 percent in a parking lot or parking garage, and 2.2 percent in a bar or night club.

Intimidation, another assault offense, is defined as “to unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.” Intimidation offenses increased 4.7 percent from the Third Quarter of 2016 to the Third Quarter of 2015.



## 2.2 Crimes Against Persons (NIBRS - Group A) Continued...

There were 45 Kidnapping/Abduction offenses in the Third Quarter of 2016 compared to 41 offenses in the Third Quarter of 2015. It is important to understand what is included in this count.

**Kidnapping/Abduction** is defined by the National Incident Based Reporting System as “the unlawful seizure, transportation, and/or detention of a person against his/her will or of a minor without the consent of his/her custodial parent or legal guardian.”

The Texas Penal Code further divides this definition into four categories: unlawful restraint, kidnapping, aggravated kidnapping, and unlawful transport. Please refer to Texas Penal Code Title 5, Chapter 20 for full definitions, but below are abbreviated definitions of each:

- **Unlawful restraint:** Intentionally or knowingly [restraining] another person.

*Restrain: Restrict a person's movements without consent, so as to interfere substantially with the person's liberty, by moving the person from one place to another or by confining the*

*person. Restraint without consent is accomplished if by force, intimidation, or deception or any means.*

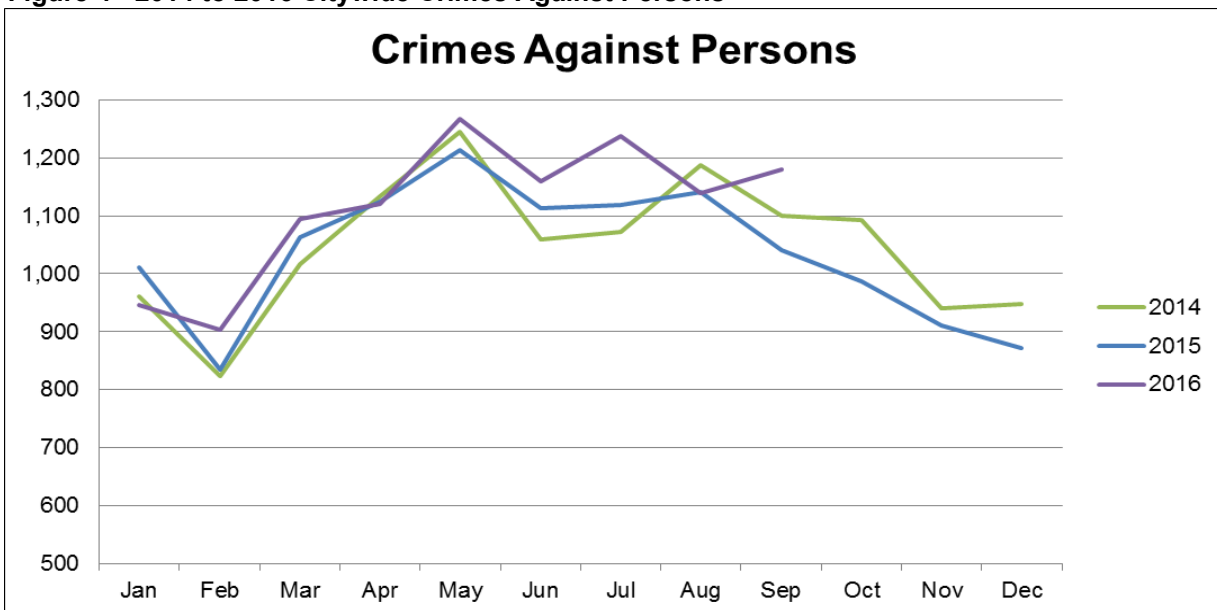
- **Kidnapping:** Intentionally or knowingly [abducting] another person ... not coupled with intent to use or to threaten to use deadly force.
- **Aggravated Kidnapping:** Intentionally or knowingly [abducting] another person with the intent [for example] to hold him for ransom or reward ... use him as a shield or hostage...inflict bodily injury.
- **Unlawful Transport:** For pecuniary benefit [transporting] an individual in a manner that is designed to conceal the individual from ... law enforcement authorities ... and [creating] a substantial likelihood that the individual will suffer serious bodily injury or death.

Of the 45 kidnapping offenses this quarter, 35 were unlawful restraints, 4 were kidnappings, and 6 were aggravated kidnappings. In 76.1 percent of all cases, the victim knew the suspect, 57.2 percent were known to be domestic-related, and in 32.2 percent of the cases, the victim was dating or married to the suspect at the time of the incident.

In the Third Quarter of 2016, forcible rape offenses increased 1.9 percent compared to the Third Quarter of 2015. Of all forcible rape offenses, 76.1 percent were known offender-related, and 44.1 percent of all victims were 17 years of age or under. The Sex Crimes Unit did not identify any serial offenders in the Third Quarter of 2016. The Sex Crime Unit continues the investigative process with the goal of bringing all perpetrators to justice.

The “Other” forcible sex offense category includes forcible sodomy, sexual assault with an object, and forcible fondling. These offenses increased 38.8 percent in the Third Quarter 2016 and approximately 80.4 percent involved victims 17 years of age or under.

## 2.2 Crimes Against Persons (NIBRS - Group A) Continued...

In the Third Quarter of 2016, the total number of victims assigned to the Special Victims Section increased by 10.6 percent compared to the Third Quarter of 2015. The number of victims assigned to the Domestic Violence Unit increased 17.1 percent. The number of victims assigned to the Sex Crimes Unit decreased 18.2 percent and the number of victims assigned to the Crimes Against Children Unit decreased 5.4 percent in the Third Quarter of 2016 compared to the Third Quarter of 2015.

The Fort Worth Police Department's Special Victims Section includes the Domestic Violence Unit, Crimes Against Children Unit (CACU), Sex Crimes Unit, and the Sex Offender Registration and Monitoring Unit.

The Domestic Violence Unit investigates incidents of domestic violence in partnership with the various agencies collocated under the One Safe Place umbrella (Tarrant County's Family Justice Center). One Safe Place brings together a multi-agency task force, under one roof, dedicated to providing coordinated services to victims of domestic violence and their children.

The Crimes Against Children Unit's mandate is to aggressively investigate abuse and sexual abuse of children under 17, as well as homicides of children under the age of six (in partnership with the various agencies under the Alliance for Children non-profit organization).

The Sex Crimes Unit (SCU) investigates sexual assault cases, indecent exposures, public lewdness, improper photography, injury to the elderly in care facilities, stalking, and any other crime of a sexual nature involving adults of 17 years old and older.

The Sex Offender Registration and Monitoring Unit is responsible for ensuring sex offenders are in compliance with registration requirements.

## 2.3 Crimes Against Property (NIBRS - Group A)

In the Third Quarter of 2016, Crimes Against Property decreased 1.1 percent overall, with 10,133 offenses reported compared to 10,248 in the Third Quarter of 2015. Burglary/breaking & entering decreased 10.7 percent while embezzlement offenses increased 56.8 percent, counterfeiting/forgery offenses increased 53.8 percent, and robbery offenses increased 12.6 percent.

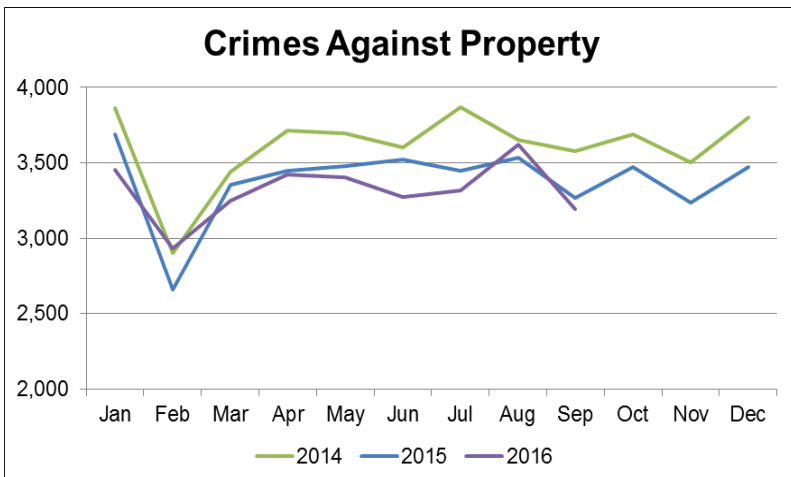

Motor vehicle theft offenses increased 2.0 percent in the Third Quarter of 2016 (625 offenses) compared to the Third Quarter of 2015 (613 offenses).

Burglary/Breaking and Entering decreased 10.7 percent with decreases in residential (-15.0 percent), and other (-13.3 percent) burglaries with an increase in business (12.6 percent). Of the 61 repeat locations, 45.9 percent were residences. In the Third Quarter of 2016, the Fort Worth Police Department arrested 172 suspects for burglary.

## 2.4 Crimes Against Society (NIBRS - Group A)

Crimes Against Society offenses are a reflection of the department's mitigation and resolution strategies. Each violation is counted as one offense. In the Third Quarter of 2016, Crimes Against Society increased 4.5 percent compared to the Third Quarter of 2015 with increases in gambling, weapon law violations, and pornography/obscene material.

## 2.5 Other Offenses (NIBRS - Group B)

Group "B" offenses are reported only when an individual is arrested. A Group "B" arrest report does not include incident data but uses only data elements that describe the arrestee and the circumstances of the arrest. Group "B" offenses decreased 7.1 percent in Third Quarter of 2016 compared to Third Quarter of 2015.

Figure 11 - Gang-Related Offenses By Division

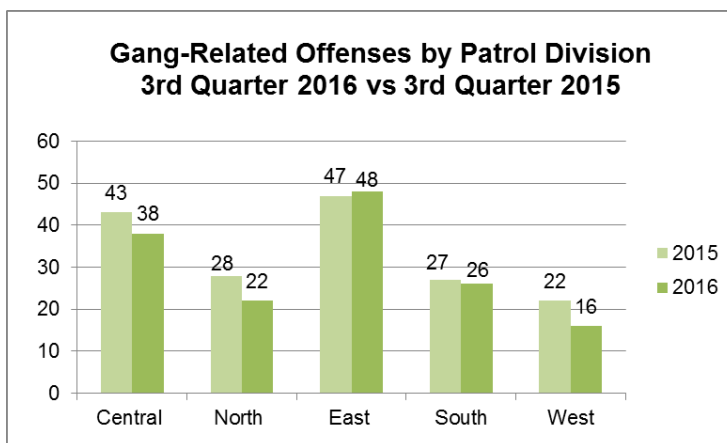
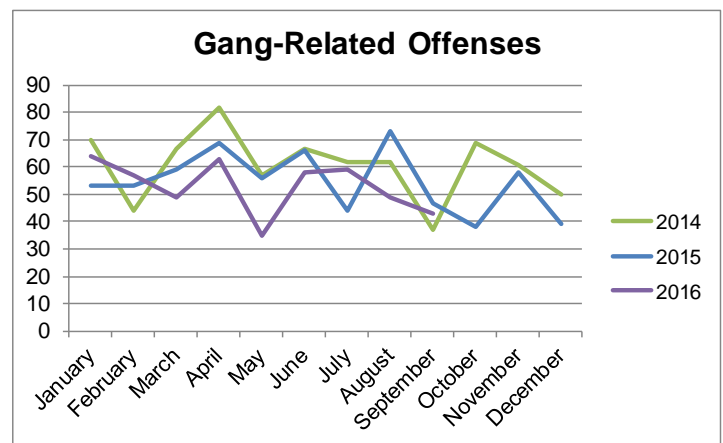
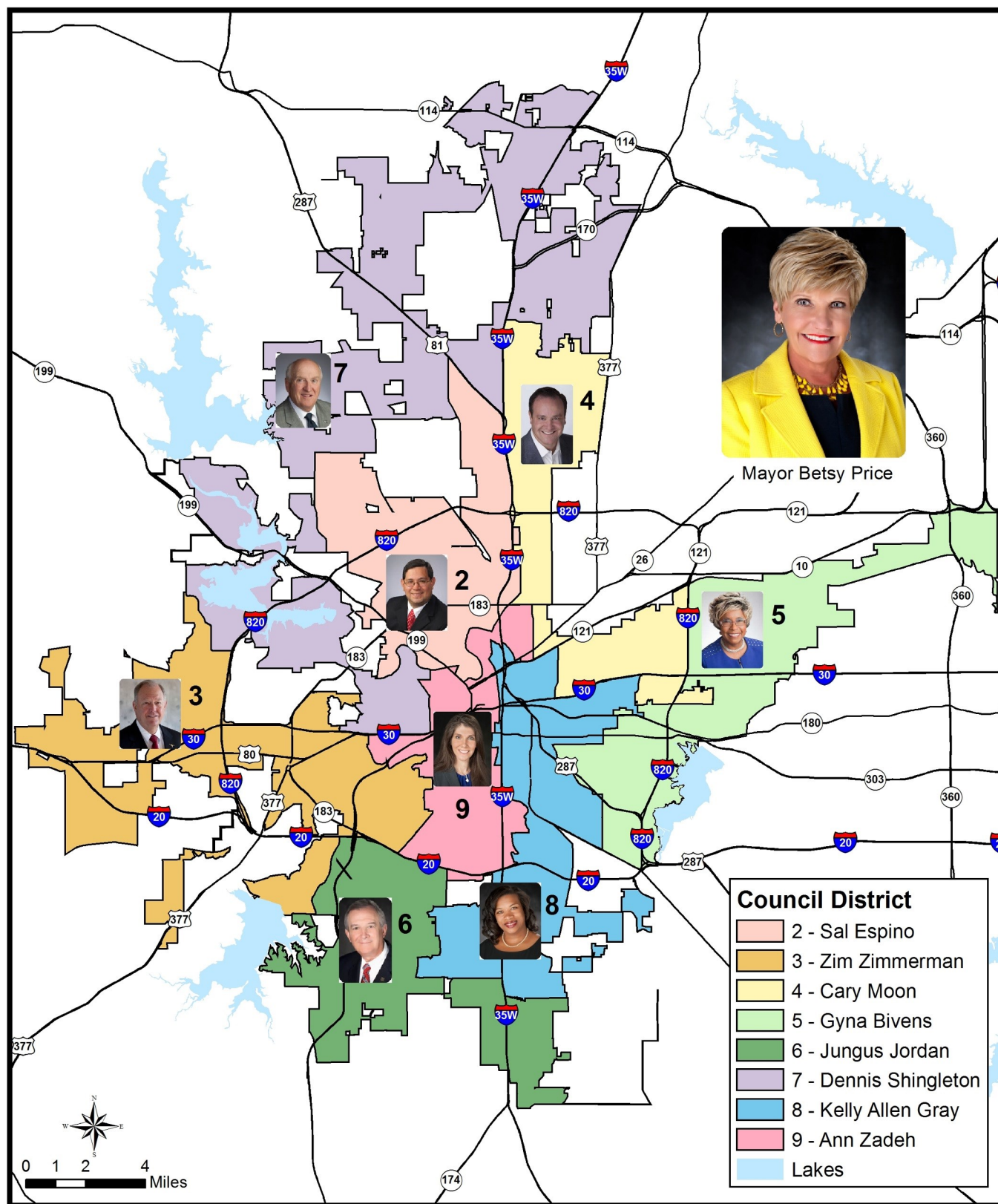


Figure 12 - Comparison of Citywide Gang-Related Offenses 2014-2016

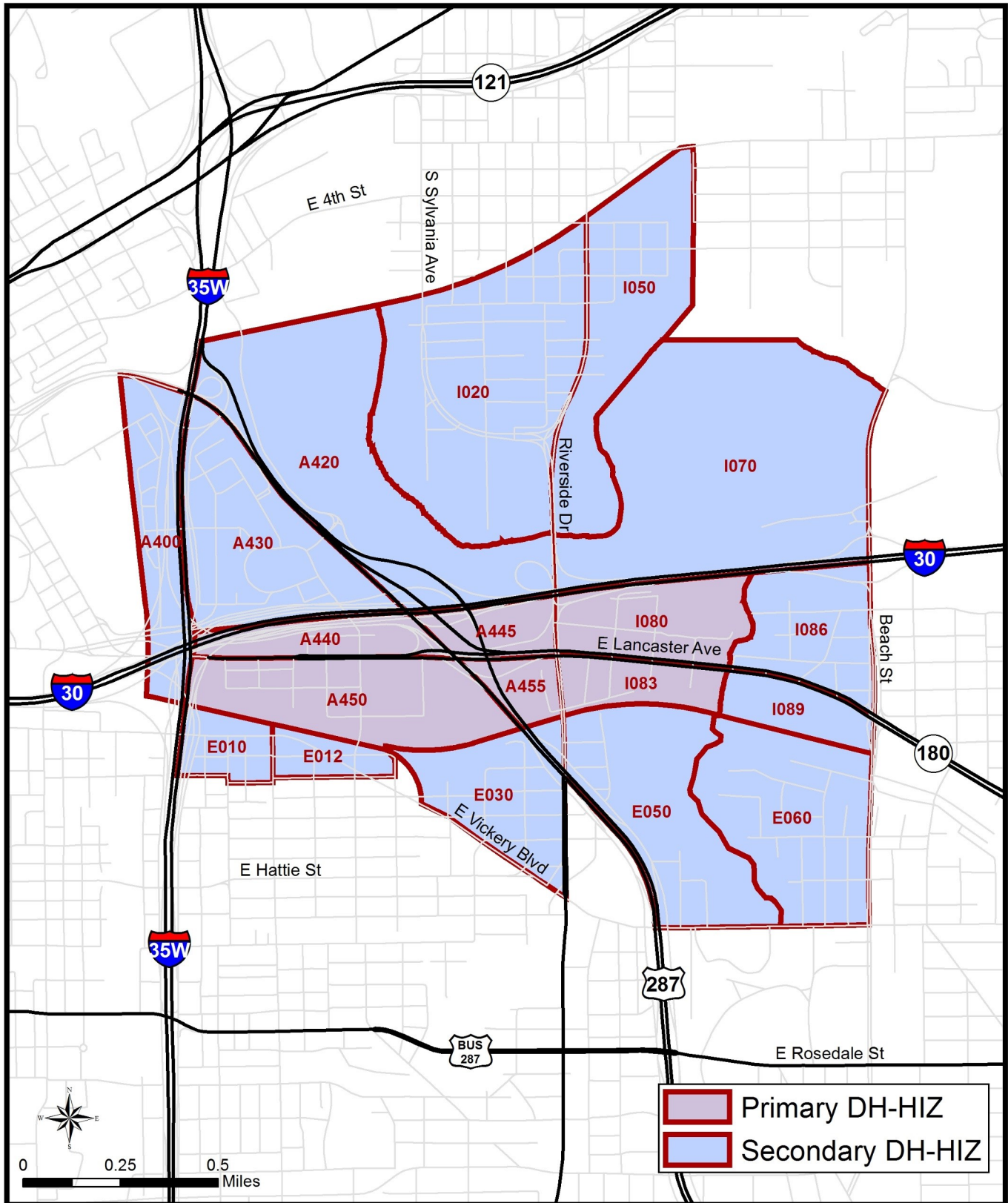

# **Department Initiatives Update**



## Grand Reopening of Cavile Place Storefront

On September 9, the Fort Worth Police Department held an open house for a new storefront at the Cavile Place apartments. More than 100 people attended including Mayor Betsy Price, District 5 Councilmember Gyna Bivens, Police Chief Joel Fitzgerald, East Division command staff and Neighborhood Police Officer LonNita Wiggins were in attendance for the dedication ceremony. The storefront will allow for increased presence in the area in an effort to strengthen relations with the community.



## Increased Recruiting Efforts

The Recruiting Unit has increased their efforts to keep pace with attrition and a rapidly growing population, and the Crime Control and Prevention District is supporting 200 recruits in FY 17. The next three Academy classes will have 60 applicants, with the first class beginning November 28, 2016. Additional classes beginning January 23, 2017 and April 17, 2017 as well as a spring Leo class will ensure a total of 200 recruits begin the Academy within FY17. In September, the Recruiting Unit visited John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York City where they made 124 potential applicant contacts in furtherance of this goal.



## Class 139 and LEO Class 16-02 Graduate from FWPD Academy

Congratulations to the graduates of recruit class #139 and Leo Class 16-02 for a job well done. On July 8, Recruit Class 139 graduated from the FWPD Academy, putting 37 new officers on the streets. The recruits were assigned to patrol divisions to begin phase one of their field training. The Leo Class graduated on July 22, putting 9 new experienced officers on the streets.



## Fort Worth Police Athletic League

The Police Athletic League (PAL) is a 501(c)(3) organization operated by Police Officers and community members. PAL currently has two boxing gyms operating; one in East Division at 3635 E Loop 820 and another in South Division at 3810 Alta Mesa Road. An official grand opening at the Eastside PAL gym is planned for early January 2017. In the spring of 2017, PAL will partner with the Park and Recreation Department to create a citywide boys and girls flag football league with locations in all patrol divisions. This will be facilitated and coached by officers and community members. Additionally, PAL will offer various summer activities and mentorship programs.



## Civilian Street Survival Class

The FWPB Motor Unit hosted its first Civilian Street Survival Class in September at the Bob Bolen Public Safety Complex. The class was attended by 23 students. The course began in a classroom with the introduction of street survival strategies including how to increase the visibility of motorcycles to other motorists, the importance of head and eye placement, contributing factors involved in motorcycle accidents, statistics of motorcycle operations and the importance of helmet use and the hazards of alcohol use. The six basic fundamentals of how to control a motorcycle were also covered. The class also utilized the driving track skills pad where two braking chutes were set up. Students were given instructions and demonstrations, and then the students practiced proper braking techniques while being observed and evaluated by instructors. The students progressed to slow cone maneuvers to increase the skill of motorcycle control. When the instructors gave instructions on how to ride the slow cone weave, offset cone weave, and a voluntary 20 foot U-turn box, most of the students had doubts about attempting the exercises. By the end of the day, nearly the entire class successfully completed the two basic cone weaves and had the confidence to attempt the 20 foot U-turn box.

The instructions and information provided were well received by the students. The class evaluations completed by the students showed that their skills and knowledge were improved by attending the course. It is hoped that this course will produce safer riders, decreasing the motorcycle accident and fatality rate in Fort Worth.
